<b>Stopping contamination spread</b>	All persons	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Providing anti-bacterial hand gel and anti-bacterial wipes / spray.</li> <li>Completion of scanning the NHS Track &amp; Trace QR Code poster, displayed on the vessel.</li> <li>Sealed Lifejacket bags with security tags.</li> <li>Lifejackets are only worn if the hirer chooses to do so, there is a notice onboard asking them to leave them out if worn.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>If lifejackets are used, they are left out to air and wiped down with anti-bacterial wipes.</li> <li>Vessel is an open boat so time to air, plus we are only providing one hire per day to maintain a safe operation.</li> </ul>	All	On arrival to the vessel

<b>Skipper contact</b>	All persons	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>No contact.</li> <li>No handshaking or hugging</li> <li>No sharing of refreshments.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Skipper to maintain 1m plus social distancing where possible and to use own equipment and lifejacket.</li> <li>No sharing of items and wear a mask if appropriate.</li> </ul>	All	Start of charter and throughout charters.
